Ohio Manufacturing Apprenticeship Accelerator

At the October Manufacturing Accelerator in Ohio, co-hosted by the Hub and Sinclair Community College, we brought together over 75 Apprenticeship stakeholders, including government and industry leaders, educators, and workforce organizations, to explore the benefits, challenges, and best practices of RAPs.

"The most important part is Apprentices," said Hub Senior Advisor Cathy Metcalf, as she presented to a room full of local labor leaders representing a dozen industries and many minority-serving local companies across Ohio. Surveying several local Apprentices who joined her at the head of the room, she joked, "If I were young again, the trades are where I would go."
